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SECTION 1

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

The County of Aroostook is requesting bids for road maintenance in the Unorganized Territory of Aroostook County from July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2021.

This contract is for the purpose of having available to the Aroostook County Commissioners' Office a resource for drainage repair; ditching; cleaning culverts; patching; grading gravel surfaces and shoulders; mowing of shoulders and slopes; removal of brush and debris; and any other work as determined by the Aroostook County Community Services Director. Force Account Work may be considered, based upon hourly/daily rates submitted by the successful bidder.

Bids requested will be for one **AREA TWO** only.

AREA TWO includes: TDR2, "E" Plantation, Connor, T15R6, T16R4 (Madawaska Lake), T16R5 (Square Lake), Sinclair, Cross Lake and Oxbow North Township.

1. All bids must be submitted on the attached bid proposal form prior to the bid acceptance date indicated. It is the responsibility of the prospective bidder to inspect the technical specifications, and contract general conditions to ensure a full understanding of the construction and equipment requirements. Any questions regarding the work should be directed to the Community Services Director at least twenty-four (24) hours before the bid due time.
2. The contract award shall be based on the following scoring formula. Based on a review and recommendation by the Community Services Director, the County Administrator and County Commissioners will be the sole judge of the acceptability of the bids and may reject any and all bids if it is judged to be in the best interest of the County of Aroostook. The Contractor may be required to produce evidence of their ability to adequately perform the work before bids are accepted.

3. Any errors or omissions detected by prospective bidders should be brought to the attention of the Aroostook County Community Services Director at least twenty-four (24) hours before the bid due date.
4. The Contractor may not be required to provide all of the equipment listed; more specifically, equipment, which would see only occasional seasonal use. The successful Contractor in **AREA ONE** may be asked to provide assistance in **AREA TWO** (southern Aroostook County), if that Contractor's equipment can be used to supplement the other Contractor's equipment, and it is deemed to be in the best interest of the County of Aroostook and the Contractor(s) to do so.
5. The County Commissioners reserve the right to accept and/or reject any and all bids.

SECTION 2

EQUIPMENT AND MATERIAL SPECIFICATIONS

Equipment:

All equipment rates per hour shall include all applicable insurance and licensing fees, and consumable supplies such as oil(s), fluid(s), fuel, tires, etc. Truck rates shall include a tailgate-mounted apron to work from when patching. Backhoe loaders used for ditching work shall be equipped with rubber street pads. All equipment rates per day shall include all required safety equipment to operate in accordance with OSHA Regulations. Labor shall be paid separately for these items. Mobilization of equipment shall be paid for at the applicable rate for that particular piece of equipment, except where the equipment must be mobilized on a trailer. In that event, mobilization shall be paid for at the applicable truck and trailer rate, and no additional payment shall be made for the mobilization of that equipment. Mobilization shall include, but not be limited to, the time required to transport the equipment from the Contractor's yard to the job site and return to the Contractor's yard. Any and all equipment left on site (after normal working hours) during any given project duration is at the contractor's discretion and risk. There shall be no allowance for daily mobilization of trailered equipment throughout the duration of any given project. Equipment used to transport materials, contractors, operators and/or workers from the Contractor's yard to any given job site and back to the Contractor's yard shall be charged the applicable rate for that piece of equipment only when it is in use.

Labor:

All labor and equipment operator rates per hour shall include all applicable insurance, overhead, and licensing costs and shall include all consumable supplies, hand tools, and other incidentals. Due to the nature of the work, the Contractor's crews may be required to work on weekends, holidays, and extended hours during regular workdays. No additional payment beyond the labor or equipment operator rates shall be made for overtime or additional benefit costs for labor. The Contractor may, on occasion, be requested to attend workshops such as those presented by the Maine Local Roads Center. Attendance is at the Contractor's expense; no additional payment will be made for attendance.

Culvert Cleaning:

The Contractor shall provide a high pressure, high temperature washer or steamer. This equipment shall include, but not be limited to, a portable power source, hose, nozzles, 100 gallons of water capacity, pumps, pipe, auxiliary lighting and any other hand tools and equipment required to clean and thaw culverts. Mobilization of this equipment will be paid for at the applicable truck rate.

Materials:

Gravel, equivalent to MDOT sub base aggregate, Type "D" meeting the following gradation:

Passing 6" sieve	100%
Passing 1/4" sieve	25-70%
Passing #40 sieve	0-30%
Passing #200 sieve	0-7%

Gravel, equivalent to MDOT base aggregate, Type "C" meeting the following gradation:

Passing 1" sieve	100%
Passing 1/4" sieve	30-55%
Passing #200 sieve	0-7%

Stone, equivalent to MDOT Stone Ditch Protection, meeting the following gradation:

Passing 12" sieve	90-100%
Passing 4 " sieve	0-15%

The successful bidder will provide written permission from the owner of the source of materials. Samples will be taken to determine the quality of the material to be provided. This item shall be paid by the CUBIC YARD. The cost per cubic yard shall include loading. Transportation shall be paid according to the equipment rates. A minimum of sixteen (16) cubic yards will be ordered at any one time, with the exception of the Type "C" aggregate, which will have a minimum quantity of eight (8) cubic yards. Quantities will be paid as determined by a quantities takeoff provided by the Aroostook County Community Services Director.

Grass Seed

Conservation mix for seeding areas ravaged as a result of road repair, including all necessary equipment, and materials required for placement in accordance with soil conservation practices. Labor will be paid separately at the contract rate.

Hay mulch

To be used for cover, including all necessary equipment and materials required for placement in accordance with soil conservation practices. Labor and transportation to the job site will be paid separately at the applicable contract rate.

Hay Bales

To be used for erosion control in ditch lines, including all necessary labor, equipment, and materials, required for placement as directed by the Aroostook County Community Services Director. Labor and transportation to the job site will be paid separately at the applicable contract rate.

Fertilizer

To be used in conjunction with seeding in accordance with soil conservation practices. Labor and transportation to the job site will be paid separately at the applicable contract rate.

Signage:

The Contractor shall provide, inclusive to the equipment and labor rates, appropriate construction signs for each crew, which shall be posted on stands capable of supporting the signs. These signs shall be placed at all times that crews are working such that the travelling public has adequate warning that there is construction work in progress and has adequate time to respond before entering the work zone. These signs shall be placed in accordance with the Standards for Work Zone Traffic Control. These signs shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

The Contractor providing the grader shall provide two (2) "Road Machinery" signs inclusive to the hourly equipment rate.

The Contractor providing the mower shall provide two (2) "Mowing Ahead" signs inclusive to the hourly equipment rate.

If flaggers are used to direct traffic, each flagger will be provided with a Stop/Slow paddle.

The Contractor shall provide all crew members with orange retro-reflectorized vests to increase their visibility while in the work area.

The Contractor may be required to provide additional signage in the future should conditions warrant.

The Contractor shall also be required to provide up to 15 each 28" retro-reflectorized traffic cones and up to 10 each of Type I and II barricades. Provisions of these articles shall be

inclusive to the equipment and labor rates, except, when they are required to be placed overnight, when the bid rate for these articles shall apply. Basis of payment shall be per each left in place overnight. The County shall not be responsible for replacement of these items in case of damage or theft.

Grader:

All equipment rates per hour shall include appropriately licensed and qualified operators, as well as all applicable insurance and licensing fees, and consumable supplies such as oil, fuel and tires. Mobilization of equipment shall be paid for at the applicable rate for that particular piece of equipment, except where the equipment must be mobilized on a trailer. In that event, mobilization shall be paid for at the applicable truck and trailer rate, and no additional payment shall be made for the mobilization of that equipment. Mobilization shall include, but not be limited to, the time required to transport the equipment from the Contractor's yard to the jobsite and return to the Contractor's yard. Equipment operator rates shall be for appropriately licensed and qualified operators, as well as all applicable insurance and licensing fees. The Contractor's equipment operator will be required to attend, within one year of acceptance of the contract, the Maine Local Roads Center's Grader Operator Training.

Mower:

Sickle or disc, minimum 6 foot width

Loader Backhoe / Excavator:

Preferably, on pavement surfaces, Loader Backhoes / Excavators used for roadside ditching shall be equipped with rubber "street" pads. All equipment rates per hour shall include all applicable insurance and licensing fees, and consumable supplies such as oil, fuel and tires. Mobilization of equipment shall be paid for at the applicable rate for that particular piece of equipment, except where the equipment must be mobilized on a trailer. In that event, mobilization shall be paid for at the applicable truck and trailer rate, and no additional payment shall be made for the mobilization of that equipment. Mobilization shall include, but not be limited to, the time required to transport the equipment from the Contractor's yard to the jobsite and return to the Contractor's yard. Equipment operator rates shall be for appropriately licensed and qualified operators, as well as all applicable insurance and licensing fees.

SECTION 3

GENERAL CONDITIONS

ARTICLE 1 – Definitions

Bidder:

Any Individual, Partnership, or Corporation submitting a proposal for the performance of the work under the terms of the contract, and acting directly, or through a Duly Authorized Representative.

Condition, Care and Safety:

The Contractor will be responsible for the safety of employees, as well as the travelling public; to ensure that proper signage and/or traffic control is maintained at the work place. The Contractor shall be responsible for implementation and compliance with all applicable OSHA requirements and regulations.

Contractor:

The Individual, Partnership, or Corporation undertaking the execution of the work under terms of the Contract with the Owner, and acting directly, or through a Duly Authorized Representative.

Correction of Work:

The Contractor shall remedy any defects due to faulty materials or workmanship and pay for any damage to other work resulting therefrom. The Owner shall give notice of observed defects with reasonable promptness. All questions arising as a result of findings shall be decided by the Aroostook County Community Services Director.

D.E.P.:

The Maine Department of Environmental Protection.

Final Completion:

The ending date of the maintenance contract is; June 30, 2021, unless the contract is extended or withdrawn by the Aroostook County Commissioners based on a recommendation by the Community Services Director before that date.

Inspection of Work:

Before placing any gravel or other materials and prior to culvert installation, prior notice must be given to the Aroostook County Community Services Director, to

ensure proper placement and installation of materials. A 100% inspection shall be maintained during culvert installation.

Labor and Wages:

The Contractor shall conform to the Labor Laws of the State of Maine, and all other laws, ordinances and legal requirements affecting the work in Maine.

Layout of Work:

The layout of any work will be completed and/or approved by the Aroostook County Community Services Director, including the staking of one side every fifty (50) feet for roadway repairs, and double stakes with line and grade for all culvert installations.

L.U.P.C.:

Maine Land Use Planning Commission.

M.D.O.T.:

Maine Department of Transportation.

M.S.D.S.:

The Aroostook County Community Services Director shall provide to the contractor two (2) copies of Materials Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) for all materials purchased for use by the Contractor. The Contractor shall provide to the Aroostook County Community Services Director with one (1) copy of the MSDS for all materials purchased by the Contractor for use in work owned by the County of Aroostook.

O.S.H.A.:

Occupational Safety and Health Administration.

Owner:

The County of Aroostook.

Payments:

Will be in accordance with the Warrant Schedule developed by the Aroostook County Commissioners' Office, generally every second Wednesday. Invoices for payment must be received by noon of the Monday preceding the warrant date.

Resident Inspector:

The Authorized Representative of the Aroostook County Commissioners' Office, typically the Community Services Director.

Subcontractor:

The Individual, Partnership, or Corporation undertaking the execution of a part of the work under terms of the Contract by virtue of an agreement between himself or herself and the Contractor. Meaning any Individual with equipment hired to perform the required tasks.

Submittals:

Submittals shall consist of three (3) copies of Certificates of Manufacture for all Corrugated Metal and Reinforced Concrete Pipe, as well as all required hardware or materials required to install said pipe. In addition, Sieve Analysis, and Moisture Density Test results for all subgrade and grade materials installed shall be required before the materials are installed in the project. The Aroostook County Community Services Director shall be responsible for this testing.

Work In Place:

Is expected to be of high quality. All work will be determined and supervised. All final ditching will be performed with a ditching bucket, with a minimum width of 48", to provide a uniform surface for subsequent maintenance. All foreslopes to be a maximum of 3:1 slope and backslopes to be a minimum of 2:1, unless changed by the Aroostook County Community Services Director.

ARTICLE 2 – Intent and Correlation of the Contract Documents

It is the intent of the contract documents to describe a complete project. The Contractor shall furnish all Labor, Materials, Tools, Transportation, Insurance, and Incidentals, which are reasonably required to maintain the listed roads. The plans including all revisions, Instructions to Bidders, the General Conditions of the Contract, Executed Contract, General Construction Specifications, and completed Bid Proposal comprise the contract documents.

Should the Contractor discover any error, omission, or inconsistency in the contract documents which would require additional costs above that shown in the bid, he shall notify the Owner at least twenty-four (24) hours before the bids are due. Should errors, omissions, inconsistencies or differing site conditions be discovered after contract award, then the Owner shall be promptly notified and affected work suspended until a resolution is found. In the event that there is a conflict between requirements of the plans and specifications, the more stringent requirements will be followed. Neither the County Commissioners Office, nor its agents take responsibility for quantities required to complete the project.

Article 3 – Permits, Laws, and Regulations

It is the responsibility of the Contractor to comply with all laws, regulations, and permit conditions, including safety regulations. If the Contractor discovers that the contract documents conflict with any laws, regulations, or permit conditions, the contractor shall promptly notify the Owner. In addition, if the Contractor's proposed methods require it, it shall be the contractor's responsibility to obtain any variances or permit modifications required.

ARTICLE 4 – Liquidated Damages

If the Contractor is in violation of any of the terms of this contract, or if the County or its representative is of the opinion that work described in this contract is being performed unsatisfactorily, the County shall notify the Contractor by certified mail setting forth the basis for the County's complaint. Upon receipt of such notice, the Contractor shall have ten (10) days to comply with the terms and conditions of this contract or rectify the unsatisfactory work. If at the expiration of the ten (10) day period, the County's representative is dissatisfied with the Contractor's performance, or the Contractor is not in compliance with the terms of this contract, the County will, by certified mail, notify the Contractor to discontinue all work to be performed under this contract. The County may thereupon, by contract, or otherwise complete the work, and the Contractor or its surety shall be liable for costs, which exceed the rate provided in this contract. Such charges shall be deemed liquidated damages.

ARTICLE 5 – Changes in the Work

The Owner may request changes, increases, or decreases of the work without invalidating the original agreement. Any changes involving a change in the contract price or time must be authorized by a Change Order executed by the Contractor and the Owner.

Hourly rates for equipment not listed specifically in the Contract Documents shall be paid for at the applicable rate as determined by the Means Construction Cost Guide, or equivalent.

ARTICLE 6 – Condition, Care and Safety

The Contractor will be responsible for the safety of employees, as well as the traveling public, to ensure that proper signage and/or traffic control is maintained at the work place. The Contractor shall be responsible for implementation of all applicable OSHA requirements and regulations.

ARTICLE 7 – Contract Termination

Should the Contractor fail to complete the work in accordance with the Contract Specifications, the Owner may, after giving written notice to the Contractor, terminate the contract and arrange for the work to be completed by others.

ARTICLE 8 – Contractors Insurance

The Contractor shall not commence work under this contract until all insurance required has been obtained. The Contractor agrees to maintain liability insurance to protect it from personal injury, death or property damage claims which may arise from operations under this contract. The Contractor shall have and maintain Workers' Compensation Insurance for his employees as required by State Law, General Liability Insurance, and Vehicle Liability Insurance during the life of the Contract in the following amounts:

The Contractor shall furnish the Aroostook County Commissioners' Office with the required Certificates of Insurance, with a minimum of that amount stated above. **SAID CERTIFICATES OF INSURANCE, IN ADDITION TO THE AMOUNT OF COVERAGE, SHALL CARRY A STATEMENT WORDED AS FOLLOWS:** *In the event of Cancellation or Expiration of any of the foregoing policies, ten (10) days written notice by the Insurance Company shall be mailed to the Aroostook County Commissioners.*

The Insurance Requirements for the Contractor shall also apply to any and all Subcontractors hired by the Contractor.

The Contractor further agrees to indemnify, assume the defense of, and save harmless the County, its agents and employees from liability, actions claims or damage for wrongful death, personal injury or property damage suffered by any person or association, which results from the willful or negligent action or inaction of the Contractor in the performance of duties, and the work performed under this contract.

ARTICLE 9 – Labor and Wages

The Contractor shall conform to the Labor Laws of the State of Maine, and all other laws, ordinances and legal requirements affecting the work in Maine.

By entering into this contract, the Contractor acknowledges and agrees that he shall serve hereunder in the capacity of an independent contractor, including but not limited to such as described in the Maine Workers' Compensation Act, 39-A M.R.S.A., 102(13), and shall not be deemed an employee or representative of the County. The Contractor understands and agrees that as an independent Contractor, no Federal or State Income Tax will be deducted by the County, and no retirement benefits, Medicare, survivor benefit insurance, group life

insurance, vacation and sick leave, workers' compensation, unemployment and similar benefits available to County employees will accrue.

ARTICLE 10 – Disputes

Any and all questions arising as a result of findings shall be decided by the Aroostook County Commissioners, or their Authorized Representative(s).

Disputes between the Owner and Contractor, which cannot be otherwise resolved, shall be settled by litigation.

ARTICLE 11 – Federal Mandates Affecting CDL Operators

The Contractor shall, after January 1, 1996, provide documentation certifying that he is in compliance with Federal Requirements regarding drug and alcohol testing for CDL operators. Failure to provide this documentation shall be grounds for contract termination.

The requirements for the Contractor shall also apply to any and all Subcontractors hired by the Contractor.

ARTICLE 12 – Storage Facilities

The Contractor in **AREA TWO** shall provide dedicated outdoor storage areas for storage of materials including, but not limited to culvert pipe and erosion control blanket. **Area Two** shall require approximately 5,000 square feet. **Area Two** will also require approximately 500 square feet of interior secure storage. This interior space will be used to store articles such as signs and associated hardware, and other small articles required for maintenance of roads throughout Aroostook County. The Contractor shall provide insurance coverage to cover the replacement of these articles due to fire, theft, or other events. These storage areas will be provided at no additional cost to the County of Aroostook.
